



Chichester Yacht Club Harbour Race Supplementary Sailing Instructions

Saturday 6th July 2024

Organising Authority: Chichester Yacht Club.

Event Location: Chichester Yacht Club, West Sussex

1. Rules

- 1.1 These Instructions are a supplement to, and should be read in conjunction with, the CYC Club Racing Notice of Race & Sailing Instructions 2024. Where the Club Racing Sailing Instructions and this supplement conflict, this supplement takes precedence. The race will be run jointly between CYC and DQSC, but finishes may be separate and results will be collated separately for each.
- 1.2 **Eligibility.** The Harbour Race is only open to dinghy classes with a current 2024 RYA Portsmouth Yardstick not greater than 1200. Boats not listed in the current PY schedule may be accepted and allocated a number at the Race Committee's discretion. This must be organised in advance with the Race Officer.

2. Schedule of Racing

- 2.1 The Harbour Race will be held on Saturday 6 July 2024 – HW 12.47 (4.4m) the warning signal is scheduled at 11.25.
- 2.2 The Harbour Race will be sailed in a single fleet and the fleet flag will be international naval numeral 0.
- 2.3 Competitors should notify their intention to race online at cyc.co.uk.
- 2.4 Competitors may enter on the day on the printed sheet in the sloop area at CYC or at DQSC.

3. Course

- 3.1 The course including start and finish line details, will be displayed on the official boards at CYC and DQSC at least 60 minutes before the published start time of the race.
- 3.2 Where there is a committee or patrol boat start the course may also be displayed on the committee boat.

4. The Start

- 4.1 The starting line shall be defined on the official board in the sloop and at DQSC at least 60 minutes before the first warning signal of the race and will be one of following:
 - 4.1.1 **Club Line Start:** The starting line will be a transit of the line between the tall flag pole in front of the CYC starters hut and a shorter prominent pole immediately in front on the foreshore. The channel marker post known as 'Number 2' post is the Outer Distance Mark.
 - 4.1.2 **Committee Boat Start:** The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the Chichester YC committee boat (usually Cyclone) at the starboard end and the course side of the port-end starting mark which will be a large orange cylindrical buoy marked CYC 0.
 - 4.1.3 **Patrol Boat Start:** The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on a Chichester YC patrol boat at the starboard end and the course side of the port-end starting mark which will be a large orange cylindrical buoy marked CYC 0.
- 4.2 The start sequence will be in accordance with RRS26 known as 5,4,1, Go.

5. The Finish

- 5.1 **Shore based finishes:** Competitors will finish at their respective home club lines. The CYC Club finish line will be passed from west to east or east to west and is a transit of the line between the tall flag pole in front of the CYC starter's hut and a shorter prominent pole on the foreshore. The yellow marker post known as **Perch** is the Outer Distance Mark. The DQSC Club Finish Line is the extension of a line between the striped, orange fixed post on the Race Box and racing mark Quay.
- 5.2 **Shortened course:** Races may be shortened at any mark of the course by displaying a flag S on a patrol boat adjacent to the mark. The finish line will be between the patrol boat and the mark of the course. This changes RRS 32.2.
- 5.3 All CYC competitors must sign off after the race on the sheets located in the sloop within 30 minutes of finishing.
